ANSWERS TO COMMON QUESTIONS

- 1. Why should the community participate in the second round of engagement?** This is a critical moment in the FRAMEWORK process. The perspective of everyone, whether they are new or life-long residents, is vital to the success of FRAMEWORK. The second round of engagement will build on input received from the first round as well as information gathered during the analysis and visioning phase of the project. Continued engagement from those who have already participated is encouraged to move the process forward. Those who have not yet participated are also encouraged to take part.
- 2. What is FRAMEWORK?** FRAMEWORK is a collaborative initiative that includes 15 jurisdictions who will focus on understanding the impacts, and potential benefits, of the anticipated investments from Intel and from the public and private sectors. The objective is to establish a development plan and strategic approach to managing growth to ensure our communities remain healthy and are successfully positioned for the future.
- 3. Why is this being done?** The announcement in early 2022 that Intel plans to construct two new leading-edge processor factories in Licking County will fuel unprecedented development. Documenting a vision of what Licking County wants to look like is important. If we do not, outside developers and other organizations will direct our growth and that will likely not be in alignment with the County's goals and values.
- 4. Who has been involved in the process?** The Thomas J. Evans Foundation is serving as a neutral convener for FRAMEWORK, and is providing leadership and staff support to the project. The Leadership Team includes an elected representative from each participating jurisdiction plus leadership from the private sector partners. Members of the public have also been involved in the process in the form of stakeholder interviews, in-person events, and online engagement. More than 85 stakeholder interviews were completed with representatives from businesses, community organizations, schools, and more from across the FRAMEWORK study area. More than 3,000 community members participated in the first round of engagement, either through in-person pop-up events or through an online survey.
- 5. What has been accomplished in the process so far?** FRAMEWORK began in July 2022 with foundational work, including getting oriented with the current conditions in the study area. The first round of engagement took place in Fall 2022. The planning team then moved to analysis and visioning. This phase included analyzing the public input received and completing technical work, such as reviewing the zoning and future land use maps within the study area and working with jurisdictions to understand future planning efforts.
